# Fryeburg Fair & Indian Head Fall Foliage Tour

September 30-October 2, 2012 (Sunday-Tuesday)

The Fryeburg Fair is a large agricultural fair held annually in Fryeburg in the U.S. state of Maine. The fair was first held in 1851, and in subsequent years has grown to become the state's largest agricultural fair. The Fryeburg fair possibly hosts the largest display of oxen and ox competitions of any fair in New England. The fair features livestock shows, harness racing, antique farm and forestry equipment displays and demonstrations, horticultural and culinary contests and displays, a petting zoo, agricultural vendor displays, live musical acts, amusement rides, and food stands. The fair, held over an eight-day period in early October, attracts more than 300,000 people annually.

Clark's Bears acted as the perfect "stopper," a visible attraction, gaining the attention of the curious passer-by. Starting in 1949, Edward and Murray, sons of Florence and Ed, began teaching and training the bears for show work. The Clark brothers and their bears delighted guests with a healthy dose of wit, humor, and hospitality as they entertained and educated the audience. The Bear Show was born! Generations later, that philosophy lives on as the Clark's offer visitors the best in family entertainment and good honest fun. You'll find it all here - an excursion on The White Mountain Central Railroad through an authentic covered bridge and into Wolfman's territory. Browse museums filled with Americana, witness the extraordinary stunts of the Yandong Chinese Acrobatic Troupe and visit many unique shops. Don't forget the featured attraction, The Bear Show - a truly original experience. All this and more await you at Clark's Trading Post - a White Mountain classic.
